

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Transitioning to a New Home

Life transitions can be unique opportunities for personal growth. At the same time, they can often be unsettling, painful, and difficult to face alone - especially for children.

Life transitions often force us to leave behind the familiar, adjust to new ways of living, at least temporarily, and can leave us feeling completely unprepared. At times, they can become major life challenges. If all life transitions were without challenges, we might never learn how resourceful and resilient we really are and can be.

Life transitions are affected by our attitudes, values, and beliefs, and acceptance of our new role(s), influence on our families, self-esteem, child-rearing methods, capacity to adapt, and mental and physical health.

Categories of transitions to be aware of:

- Emotional: personal experiences, e.g. bereavement, divorce or separation of parents due to divorce/transitions.
- Physical: moving to a new home, class, or school.
- Intellectual: moving from one type of organisation to another, for example, from nursery to elementary school, primary school to secondary school, or secondary school to university.
- Physiological: going through puberty or a long-term medical condition. A life transition can be positive or negative, planned or unexpected. Some life transitions may arise out of positive experiences, for example getting married, going away to college, starting a new job, moving to a new city, or giving birth to a child. Other transitions happen without warning, and they may be quite stressful. Examples can be cases of accidents, death, divorce, job loss, or serious illness.

How to go about transitioning to a new home:

Families transition between countries for different reasons. Moving can take place because of a job transfer or new job opportunity. Research shows that 86% of families relocate with their working spouse/partner/parent. It is also reported that expat assignments fail because of adjustment issues, dissatisfaction/unhappiness with a spouse/partner, family issues, and lack of organisational support.

Phases of Transition:

There are a number of different phases of transition. (Note that these phases are not always linear.)

- Honeymoon phase: anticipation/fascination/dream come true/engagement/pleasure

- Hostility phase: withdrawal/frustration/anger/fear/judgment/pain
- Adjustment phase: integration/acceptance/flexibility
- Feeling at home phase: enthusiasm/acceptance of norms and new culture
- Identify social support/develop a good (healthy) support network
- Set future goals for advancement/fun - personal and as a family
- Try to do the five Ps: pay attention/get perspective of the situation/pause/play/make peace

Ways to reduce family stress/ anxiety during transitions:

The most common mental health issues that are brought on by adjustment stress are relationship issues, family problems, behavioural issues in children, marital problems, and communication issues. If these issues don't get resolved, or your family doesn't develop the skills to cope, symptoms of adjustment, anxiety, and depression can become more severe and may result in a more complex mental health diagnosis. Consult a mental health professional for assistance and support. Psychotherapy begins with the identification of the stressor, as consciously recognised or acknowledged by the patient. Psychotherapeutic counselling is aimed at reducing the stressor, improving the ability to cope with stressors that cannot be reduced or removed, and developing emotional states and support systems that enhance adaptation and coping.

TOP TIPS:

- Plan a daily routine and stay focused as much as possible
- Integrate humour and laughter into your daily life
- Begin and maintain a healthy lifestyle
- Practice mindfulness - breathing techniques/yoga
- Learn to say, "Yes," and, "No," and to take a time-out
- Get adequate sleep
- Travel for pleasure and fun if possible
- Explore what the new country has to offer - think of it as a learning experience
- Volunteer your time
- External resources can also be utilised to assist in the transition process. For example, information about clubs/groups/activities is published in magazines.

The most important thing when dealing with a transition is to vocalise your fear, as, most likely, these feelings will be shared by friends in a similar situation.

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The Parents Dos and Don'ts

Choosing a school for your child is tricky anywhere. In the megacity of Shanghai it can be even more puzzling. Just as carving out a career in modern China has its inevitable dilemmas for expats, growing up and learning intensively here is sure to be a challenge, as well as a rich opportunity, for the whole family. All the more reason to face these challenges in the best possible setting. For most families, that setting will be one of the many International Schools that make up the backbone of modern, world-class education in Shanghai.

To quickly inform anyone unaware: "International School" denotes an institution dedicated to educating the children of foreign communities. With some exceptions, Chinese citizens do not typically attend these schools; if the child of a Chinese national does attend one, this is almost always because one parent is from a foreign country the couple has chosen to retain foreign citizenship. International Schools' curriculums are not overseen by the Chinese Ministry of Education. If you are seeking a fuller immersion in Chinese language or exposure to its educational system, then this guide is not for you.

The decision process is one that can usher in heated family discussions. Having passed through primary school and looking forward to the last phase of secondary

education, your teen may well have their own ideas about where to undertake the crucial last stretch of the race. Is expanding language ability and multicultural experience the most important factor? Or do they need/wish to orient their choice around an ultimate college destination in your home country?

However your family decides to make the final plunge, run through this minimal check list of Dos (what to go for) and Don'ts (what to avoid) before you start the process of researching your potential schools in-depth.

Parent Dos

- Make a long-list of potential schools, then narrow this down to two or three possible destinations based on your minimal requirements.
- Take a holistic view. In deciding what your minimal requirements are, try to consider not only where you would like your child to go from now, but how their experience of education has gone so far. Not only their proven strengths and weaknesses but the chance to face new challenges and grow.
- Consider early on the single-country/international-focus option. Some schools have an obvious connection to a source

country while others boast a more integrated curriculum. In both cases, the greater background context of China will still make a big difference. Take the time to consider what the benefits might be from a totally unique school experience.

- Assemble information from a variety of sources. This is important when making your long list. In making first judgments of schools, consult the material produced by the school itself such as articles, assessments online, or even magazines like this one. Word of mouth information from peers can be useful, but may also be misleading. There may also be social groups organised by graduates of individual schools.
- Remember to factor in practical logistics. This is an obvious reminder - and all the more reason to include it. Where is the school located? Can, or should, we move house to get closer to a desirable one? How will other variables (design, age of facilities, security, reliability of administrative staff) affect the outcome?

Parent Don'ts

- Make judgments based entirely on a recognised brand or legacy. A connection to another school, or even country, that commends respect should have only a slight effect on your thinking; in this complex, changing country, a variety of factors will influence the quality of education offered by each school.
- Forget to connect to communities already involved with the schools on your shortlist: insofar as possible, do a little outreach to any groups of parents or students who have invested their time in a given school. As well as basic information, knowing them a little will help you to decide if you wish to join their community.
- Be daunted by waiting lists and other procedural hassles. China often displays a baffling (to the expat mind) combination of efficiency and disorganisation. A bit of patience, politeness, and consistent pressure will help you overcome administrative hurdles, as long as your child is qualified. Do not be afraid to ask specific questions (as politely as possible) about hiring practices. Whether you ask the school directly, or find another trusted source, it is worth spending sometime being as probing as you can - without trying to be Sherlock Holmes. Remember that teachers should be incentivised, happy, and career driven, as well as trustworthy and competent. Their well-being is crucial for ensuring a great experience for your child. Is it possible to find out the retention rate of teachers? What pay and benefits do they receive? What are the background checks and other safety and security standards applied?
- Neglect your son or daughter's input. We've already mentioned it, but at this phase of learning the human personality is gearing up for a lifetime of tough decisions. Even if by chance they profess to be apathetic, encourage them to participate in this process, one that is sure to influence their fast-approaching adulthood, whether that takes place in China or far, far away. 

Sound Advice

Whether your family is seasoned in the international schooling circuit or this is your first time having to choose a school abroad, it can be an overwhelming process full of so many questions. To help, we have answered some of the most common questions for you.

Q. What are some of the factors parents should be aware of when choosing a school?

Parents should consider the goals they have for their child(ren), and understand the curriculum, accreditations, teacher qualifications and environment they are looking for. Fortunately, Shanghai has a wide range of options for expat children. Discuss the most important things you are looking for and consider this with your child before you begin looking at schools. Many schools also offer tours when school is in session to offer a glimpse into a usual school day.

Q. What admissions criteria are usually required by international schools? Is a visa required before applying?

According to government requirements, all children applying to registered international schools must hold a foreign passport, be the child of a foreign passport holder, or have been born overseas. You don't need a visa at the point of application, but international schools are required to show copies of valid visas, resident permits or proof of processing for all enrolled


students. Admissions will vary slightly among schools, with some requiring teacher references and additional admission tests to be taken. For specific questions on eligibility, parents should contact the admissions department at the school(s) they are considering.

Q. Is it advisable for families to apply to more than one school?

While this is up to the individual family, it is advisable to visit a number of schools and apply to those that best suit your child's learning and experience needs. Some schools have waiting lists for certain grades and deadlines during the year, so families should apply as early as possible to the school(s) of their choice.

Q. Once finishing high school, will my child have qualifications to get them into a Western college or university?

International schools provide internationally recognised programmes which allow a student to access universities in a wide range of countries. University matriculation opportunities are determined by graduation (diploma) from an accredited international school, and may also include the results from a recognised external examination authority such as the Advanced Placement (AP) American Programme, UK A Levels, or the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP). **SF**



International Schools

Learn about international school options, from preschool to high school

International Baccalaureate

The International Baccalaureate Organization (IB) offers high-quality and challenging educational programmes for four different age groups: PYP (Primary Years Programme), MYP (Middle Years Programme), DP (Diploma Programme) and CP (Career-related Programme). Students who graduate from the IB programme are academically prepared for university courses and research has shown that IB graduates perform exceptionally well compared to non-IB students.

Promoting open communication based on understanding and respect, IB encourages students to become active and compassionate learners, and focuses on the child as a person and their social, emotional, and physical well-being.

For students who thrive in a high-pressure, discursive environment, the IB programme offers a qualitative and explorative educational experience.

PYP

The IB Primary Years Programme is for children aged 3-12 and the programme aims to nurture and develop young students into lifelong learners. The inquiry-led syllabus challenges students to think for themselves and place a responsibility in their own learning as they explore local and global issues in real-life contexts.

MYP

The IB Middle Years Programme has been developed for children aged 11-16 and is comprised of a challenging framework that promotes children making practical connections between what they are studying and the world around them. The MYP programme is commonly a five-year programme in which students partake in eight subject groups which provide a broad education for early adolescents that prepares them for the IB Diploma Programme (DP).

DP

This Diploma Programme offered by IB World Schools prepares students aged 16-19 years old. The programme aims to develop the minds of students who have a vast depth of knowledge and who are poised to flourish physically, intellectually, emotionally, and ethically. The curriculum is made up of six subject groups and students will be challenged with reflecting on the nature of knowledge, independent research, and community service.

CP

The IB's Career-related Programme is a syllabus of international education that integrates the values of IB in to a programme that suits the needs of a career-driven student. The programme promotes higher education, accessibility to apprenticeships, and obtaining future employment. **SF**

Advanced Placement

Advanced Placement (or AP) is a programme run by College Board that facilitates the acquisition of college credits while still in high school. It is designed to give students the experience of an introductory level college class that can qualify learners for more advanced classes upon entrance to North American colleges.

AP exams, typically written in May, test students in over 38 applicable AP subjects and are a great way to challenge high school students academically while showing a stronger emphasis on education that will enhance a college application.

If your child learns well in a fast-paced, material driven environment, and has a strong sense of self-discipline, the AP Programme offers them an opportunity to start exhibiting college level achievements early on. Often, up to or over an hour of outside class work is required on a nightly basis, so, strong reading skills and feeling comfortable asking for help when needed are beneficial to an AP student.

The AP Programme is especially valuable if you and your child aren't looking for the two-year commitment of the Interna-

tional Baccalaureate (IB) or A Levels. It also circumvents the structural rigidity that comes with the IB Diploma programme, allowing students to complete individual courses or combinations of them. With APs, your child can demonstrate their academic success in a curriculum that's individually tailored to best fit their passions and abilities.

Nearly all American and Canadian universities will accept AP scores for credit. AP credits are also accepted in more than 100 different countries. But even if they won't allow credit transfers, they are internationally recognised for their rigor.

Though APs may be accepted at many international institutions, it's important to research each one's policy. Certain UK schools have a quota of APs your child must take in order to even qualify to apply, and many will only accept certain scores to fulfill it.

Lastly, while taking APs may not be worth much if your child doesn't have the GPA to supplement it, it is possible for students to use the programme to counter and show improvements in subjects they may have previously struggled with. **SE**

A Levels

A Levels are subject-based qualifications achieved as part of the General Certificate of Education (GCE's) offered in the UK curriculum courseware. A Levels are required for University entrance and conditional acceptance by UK post-secondary institutes are based on the grades attained.

Generally, students can expect to take three A Levels in order to obtain offers from various universities. A Levels have no specific subject requirement which allows students to combine their areas of interests, however, most students choose to pick their A Level courses based on their desired degree subject. Many of the higher-level degree subjects do require specific A Levels for acceptance to the programme so it is important to plan your A Level choices accordingly.

The British Government have reformed A Levels to a more linear style of learning comprised of coursework and a set of terminal exams. A grade is given for each A Level exam, from A-E and these scores are the gateway to most university and college courses. As well as a grade, your child will also receive a uniform mark scale (UMS) which is a mark out of 600. Students are welcome to re-sit the exams for different units in order to improve their grade/score.

The ability to heavily concentrate your

studies is one that is unique to the A Level programme, and is not uncommon for participants to study in subject combinations like Art and Mathematics, or History and Science, making it an educational opportunity that emphasises individual choice at an early age.

While many universities look for applicants to have A Levels in line with the subject the students plan to enroll in, individuals do have a large degree of flexibility when selecting their A Levels of study. However, someone that thinks they might be interested in a STEAM degree programme in the UK but is unsure about an intensive, STEAM-centric high school experience, might find that A Levels are not the best option for them. While A Levels revolve around focus and flexibility, some students may benefit from an inherently diverse and broad curriculum.

Most commonly, UK universities will reach a conditional admission agreement with applicants, whereby students agree with universities to get a certain grade on their A Levels (usually anywhere from an A to a C, depending on the university standards), and if they deliver those grades they are accepted onto the course.

If your child is pursuing a specialised degree, it is recommended that their A Levels be a mix of particular subjects. **SF**

IGCSE

For those of you looking for a UK-based curriculum, you will most probably be considering the GCSE or IGCSE programme. The International General Certificate of Secondary Education is an English language curriculum which prepares students for IB and A Level examinations.

Many of the British-curriculum schools will now be accredited with Edexcel International GCSE distinction, an exam-based curricula that tests the knowledge of individual subjects, awarding one 'IGCSE' qualification for each successful subject exam. Students begin studying courseware at

the beginning of high school and will generally take the examinations in Year 11. Through the Cambridge or Edexcel IGCSE, a flexible programme of study can be curated with a variety of subjects. Most of the subjects offer tiered examinations which makes the IGCSE programme suitable for students of varying levels, as well as students learning English as their second language.

The IGCSE programme is a precursor to A Level, AP, and IB certification, and is only completed in the first two years of high school. **SF**



STEAM

What is STEAM education?

STEM or STEAM is the acronym for the studies of science, technology, engineering, (arts) and maths. These subjects form the basis for skills that are required in today's society and the ever-changing job market of the future.

In the past, many students have shied away from subjects that are perceived to be as 'boring' or tedious and graduates of these STEAM programmes are waning due to students disengaging from realising the real-life applications of STEAM subjects in daily life. For many students, maths, sciences, technology, and engineering subjects have become a set of rules and formulas to memorise, rather than to learn and engage with.

This is where STEAM learning is vital for the evolving education of our young ones. STEAM is the future. Each subject in STEAM-based curriculums is approached in a way that engages children from pre-school to high school and ultimately produces creators, thinkers, problem solvers, innovators, and inventors.

Why is STEAM education important?

STEAM education is being touted as one of the most important areas of study for students of all ages. Since the United States has pushed for STEAM learning across the country in 2009, the US has seen over 25,000 additional engineering graduates and more than 50,000 new maths and science teachers.

1. Focus on Fun' Approach

This is specifically important for young learners as the 'focus on fun' attitude is the best approach to delivering education to any early childhood student.

2. Tailored to students' learning level

STEAM activities are designed to be appropriate for the developmental process of all student ages. Teachers work to develop programmes that are engaging and interesting whilst staying within the students' abilities. A great STEAM challenge encourages students to seek new information and creatively solve problems.

3. It is hands-on


Much like other ECE curriculums, STEAM focuses on the importance of experiential learning, practical inquiry, and hands-on processes. Learning by doing is paramount for this form of education and hands-on activities make STEAM experiences more fun and easier for students to engage.

4. It is skill based

STEAM education not only focuses on the skills needed to complete challenges in the fields of science, technology, engineering, arts, and maths, but also on skills that reach beyond STEAM learning. Collaboration, estimating, calculating, communicating, and hypothesising are skills that are used for open-ended inquiry tasks and help direct children in problem solving which can be applied in their daily lives.





- 3. Have them track their spending:** If your children have allowances, advise them to write their purchases every day. This will encourage them to think about how they're spending.

4. Offer savings incentives: If you're having trouble motivating your kids to save, try the "matching contribution" principle. For example, if your child has set a big savings goal, say a 4,000 RMB tablet, you could offer to match a percentage of what he or she saves 50/50. Alternately, you could offer a reward when your kid reaches a savings milestone, such as a 500 RMB bonus for hitting the halfway mark.

5. Set a good example: If you want your children to become savers, being one yourself can help. Parents can also help their children by putting money aside. Finding the right tax-efficient vehicles could help maximise what you save for your children.

Anyone feeling daunted by the prospect of preparing their children financially for adult life should remember that investing is a medium to long-term commitment. As your children grow up, so, too, should their financial acumen and assets. It doesn't need to be rocket science. **SP**

Why Bilingual?

Shanghai parents Taowei and Ivy share insight into why they chose a bilingual school and why a bilingual school experience can prove to be a great option for your children.

When did you begin looking for a school?

Taowei: I started looking for an elementary school for my son when he was in PreK-4.

Ivy: I researched for a primary school for my son, Tuoyu, very early on and had my heart set on SMIC School.

What made you interested in choosing a bilingual school for your child initially?

Taowei: I wanted my son to be in a school where he would be spending the same amount of time learning English as he would his mother tongue, Chinese. This is so that in the future he would be able to study whichever country he wishes.

Ivy: In my community, there were many kids who attended bilingual schools and they all seemed to have strong language capabilities in both Chinese and English, excellent manners and a broad, open view of the world; all very good reasons to consider a bilingual environment.

What three factors were the most important for you to consider before choosing a school?

Taowei: There were many factors to consider, such as English language support, positive environment, tuition fees, school

curriculum, school reputation etc., but here are my top three:

1. The school's curriculum, teaching methods and learning materials.
2. Distance, for us it had to be less than 30 mins by car.
3. The school's facilities.

Ivy: Location was the most important for us. In fact, the main reason we chose SMIC was because it is next door to our home; this greatly helps with time management. The other two factors were for our son to be strong in both English and Chinese and for him to have experiences that would expand his view as a global citizen.

What benefits/changes have you noticed so far?

Taowei: The school follows a positive discipline policy whereby teachers talk issues through with the students so that children understand how to learn from their mistakes and solve problems rather than simply penalising them

Ivy: Being in bilingual environment has helped our son's English language capability grow dramatically, and his Chinese is comparable with public primary school kids. By having the language advantage of both English and Chinese, he has access to more resources.

What advice would you share with other parents currently looking for a school?

Tawei: Every child is unique, and so is each school. By carefully selecting the ideal school for your child, trust that they will adjust accordingly while enjoying the experience. Not only will they learn key life values, the importance of hard work, the joy of discovery and failing forward, but also be given opportunities to find where their talents lie.

Ivy: My advice is to make a decision regarding your child's education path as early as possible, and then do whatever is necessary to see that plan come to fruition. Try to avoid putting too much pressure on your children, especially when comparing their academic potential with others. From my observation, with the right amount of time, support, and patience, all children have the ability to make their future dreams a reality. **SF**

Montessori Education

Montessori education is a method of learning which is based on self-guided activity, hands-on learning, and collaborative play. Children in Montessori classrooms will be led to make creative choices in regards to their learning as well as being offered a variety of age-appropriate resources to help aid in their individual exploration.

Developed by Dr Maria Montessori, a Montessori education promotes experiential learning which leads to a deeper understanding of language, mathematics, science, and social learning as well as a number of other important learning stages. Each and every material provided in a Montessori classroom or curriculum supports some level of a child's development and helps to encourage a child's natural interests based on experience and learning at the child's own pace.

Montessori For All Ages

The Montessori education method has been devised for children from birth through to middle school, though Montessori in Shanghai is most commonly focused on Early Years learning.

Birth to Three Years Old

- Promote safe, engaging, and nurturing environment for children.
- Encourage trust in the child's self and their world.
- Develop confidence in their natural abilities.

- Offer chances to inspire independence in daily life.

The Montessori Classroom

Montessori classrooms are designed to be peaceful, happy places that meet the developmental needs of every child during their various stages of life. The classrooms contain places for children to learn and play in a variety of different ways and with different mediums and cater to individual, pair, small group and large group activities. The entire classroom is used with stations set up inside, outside, at the tables as well as on the floor with toys and educational items scaled to the child's size. The classroom has no one focal point and the teacher promotes a community within the classroom where children are taught to regulate their own social interactions and trained to resolve tensions and conflicts themselves.

Through fun role-play and appropriate modelling activities, a Montessori teacher demonstrates the best way to respond in new situations and gives the child confidence to act on their feelings and learned interactions when problems arise.

A Montessori classroom promotes children moving freely throughout their environment and choosing activities that interest them. The teacher is there to facilitate ideas, but movement is unrestricted for the children and they are encouraged to work individually or in groups based on what activities are attractive to them. **SF**

Preschool vs Kindergarten

Early Years Education in Shanghai

As parents living abroad, decisions about our children's education can be some of the most stressful and time-consuming that we make. With a myriad of daycare centres, preschool and kindergartens, featuring a variety of educational philosophies, it can be a grueling decision to find the best fit for your child, family, schedule and location. For anyone with kids between the ages of 18 months to 6 years old, the options for schooling can be just as vast as those for primary or secondary students, and in some cases, equally as competitive. Shanghai Family is here to take some of the mystery out of this complex decision.

A lot of confusion stems around the terminology of the types of schools available, which may be different from the system used in one's home country. Another big choice revolves around which educational philosophy best suits your goals for you child or aligns with your parenting principles. We will cover some of the types of schools most frequently found in Shanghai.

Types of Schools for Early Learners

Kindergarten: There are a few basic types of schools for early childhood, which is considered any schooling before primary begins at age 6. Perhaps the most common type in Shanghai is kindergarten, which tends to be for kids ages three-six, but many schools also have a 'nursery' class for 2-3 year olds. A distinguishing feature

of these schools is that they tend to be programmes with five full days a week, which can make them more suitable for working parents. These schools also often have a strong academic focus, in preparation for grade curriculums will vary by school, of course, so it is important to visit a prospective school and understand their unique offerings. Many kindergartens are bilingual, with both English and Chinese language used. This type of school can be a good stepping stone to a more competitive primary school with an interview enrollment process.

Preschool: Another type of school is typically called a preschool. While some preschools can accept children up to age six, the general focus of a preschool is younger, around two to four years old, and they often enroll children as young as 18 months. Preschools might offer more flexible scheduling, like half days or part-time attendance each week. The curriculum is also more likely to be play-based and focused on social and emotional development, with any academics as supplementary. This structure promotes social interaction and growth, with learning resulting naturally through play. It can also be a more gentle way to allow young children to adjust to a school environment, structured days and becoming independent. As with kindergartens, there is a plethora of various philosophies and even language programmes for parents to explore.

Daycare: There are also a couple daycare programmes in the city, which are typically non-academic, safe, and fun places for children of working parents to spend the work days. However, due to the popularity of the family 'Ayi', it may be more difficult to find a suitable place for younger toddlers and infants.

Nursery: A final type of school parents may want to consider for the early years is the nursery department of an international school. International schools themselves are usually geared at primary age and above. However, many offer a connected nursery department for those children who are too young to begin formal schooling. This can be a great option for parents that had planned to send their child to that particular school in the future.

Educational Philosophies

Each school typically prescribes to their own mission statement and philosophy of education, so, it is important to confirm that these align with what you are expecting from your chosen school. Two of the more common types of schools you will find in Shanghai are Montessori and IB schools. You may have heard of these but are unsure of the meaning or the respective benefits of each.

Montessori: Montessori is a method of education and model of human development based on the research and work of Maria Montessori. The model is based on the

principle that humans develop through interaction with the environment, and that there is an innate path to this development.

International Baccalaureate

IB, or the International Baccalaureate, was initially developed in Sweden for international schools and is world renowned for its high academic standards and emphasis on creativity and critical thinking. It is a programme eventually ending with an internationally recognised IB diploma, which is suitable for entrance to universities and colleges worldwide. But what does this look like for ages three-six? The IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) offers a curriculum framework for individual schools to implement through 'units of inquiry'. Within each transdisciplinary unit, students are encouraged to explore the topic through a variety of perspectives, ask questions, and let their natural curiosity guide the direction of their study and the learning experiences the teacher provides for them. The programme aims to balance "the acquisition of significant and relevant knowledge and skills, the development of conceptual understanding, the formation of personal positive attitudes and the capacity to take responsible actions". An IB school may also be a great fit for children who will continue on to IB international or bilingual schools for their primary or secondary years. 

Parenting in Perspective

Shanghai dad, Sal Haque, shares his feelings and experiences on trying to be the perfect parent for his young son.

Parenting can be a difficult and dynamic endeavour. It requires poise, tact, and infinite amounts of patience. There are good days and there are bad, and at times, fatigue kicks-in, frustration rises, and anger dawns. A five-year-old can wear down a dad's patience like a pair of Feiyues at a music festival. Combine that with the hustle of work, general life issues, and limited emotional outlet, and it's fair to say that sometimes we slip a little in our parenting. After all, we're human too.

We try to uphold the highest standards for our children, and consciously allowing our kids to digress can often result in stress and concern. Perhaps you forgot a warm sweater and now he seems cold? Jah-forbid, he eats a couple of donuts for breakfast... for shame! I did that once and I did not feel good about it. When I met my fellow parents at school, I pulled the "single -dad card" and waned sympathetically about not having enough time to prepare a healthy breakfast.

But ya know what? It just wasn't a big deal. My kid usually eats "relatively" healthy, he lives in a nurturing environment, he's well-loved, and overall he's happy. Plus, there are few things in this world as spectacular as a Tim Horton's Rainbow Sprinkle Donut. More importantly, one day my five-year-old is gonna be 30 years old, probably bald, and most likely an accountant (he can smell a strongly worded

memo from miles away). I'm sure that one time he was cold, or the night he fell asleep watching Dragon Ball, won't affect his Chartered Accountancy Test scores.

As a parent, I've resigned myself as a steward to an unreasonable five-year-old with selective hearing. I think it's safe to say that there'll be a few times when I'm tired or straight-up busy and I quite simply employ the time-honoured method of "screw it". Fine! Eat your cereal in your obtusely built pillow fort barricading the kitchen door. Cause who needs a kitchen? But it's important to realise these "concessions" in parenting probably won't do much harm. I often have to imagine my kid as an average middle-aged man, complete with thinning hairline and an emerging gut. Kind of like a half-Asian Burt Reynolds.

It's tough to envision him out of his age of innocence but I find it really helps put my parenting in perspective. I'm able to assess problems with more clarity and often come to realise that in most cases it's not even really a problem and certainly not a cause for frustration or anger. Like yeah, he's having a tough time writing the letter "K", but it's all good, I'm pretty sure 30-year-old Nesta (my kid's name) will be tearing up words like "Kalimba" or "Kangaroo".

I find a bit of perspective can really afford us a stoic sense of calm. Even in cases of

sickness, it's safe to say that most children recover pretty well. It's inconvenient and sucks for the kid, but how much is it gonna affect 30-year-old Nesta? He probably won't even remember it. The same goes for a break in routine or a day of artisanal hot-dog-bun nutella sandwiches. In most cases, the kid is gonna be just fine.

So, remember, it's ok to slip up in our parenting, and sometimes we might find ourselves

saying, "screw it", and that's ok too. For all the minor issues our children face, and for all the times we've side-lined our A-game for the far more convenient D-game, one day our kids will grow up, they'll probably be bald, and they'll definitely be an accountant and they'll be just fine.

Cause really, a lot of the little problems that affect us as parents aren't even really problems. **SF**

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Five Most Common Childhood Illnesses

Specialists at Mount Elizabeth Hospitals on behalf of **ParkwayHealth** explain the five most common childhood illnesses and offer advice on how to help your child recover.

School plays an important role in a child's learning and in their physical, social and emotional development, but it is also a hotspot for bacteria and viruses. Here we present the five most common childhood illnesses as well as expert advice on the best methods for recovery and when it may be necessary to seek medical treatment.

Common Cold

You probably know the drill: treat a mild fever, congestion, coughing, and a sore throat with lots of fluids and rest. Colds usually trigger an immune system response that causes sore throats, coughing, sneezing, a stuffy nose, mild fever and headaches. Although it is rare for a common cold to develop into a more serious case, like pneumonia, it is better to see a doctor when symptoms manifest with more coughing, breathlessness and a persistent fever.

Prevention Tip:- Make sure your child washes their hands properly and remind them to avoid touching their eyes, nose, or mouth. You can also strengthen your child's immune system by making sure they get enough sleep, eat a healthy diet, and get lots of exercise.

Influenza (Flu)

The flu comes on hard and fast and tends to be more severe than a cold, with patients confined to their bed while ill. Compared to a common cold, flu symptoms consist more of a fever up to 40°C, headaches, and muscle pains, than coughing, a sore throat or a runny nose, and can sometimes also cause vomiting and diarrhoea. When the flu strikes the young, there is a higher chance of developing pneumonia. Consulting a doctor early can reduce this risk.

Prevention tip:- Remind your children to wash their hands frequently and thoroughly, and to wear a face mask to prevent spreading it to others. Influenza vaccinations are up to 90% effective in preventing the flu, two weeks after the injection.

Pink Eye

Your child may complain of eye irritation or sensitivity to light, and you may notice excessive tearing or discharge, swollen eyelids and redness in the whites of the eyes (hence the name 'pink eye'). Pink eye can be the result of either an infection or allergy but is most commonly caused by viruses, meaning it usually resolves on its own without treatment. However, if the condition is caused by a bacterial infec-

tion, antibiotic eye drops or ointment will be required.

Prevention tip:- Pink eye is easily passed from person to person. Children who have been diagnosed should be kept out of school until are no longer contagious. Remind kids to not touch their eyes, nose, or mouth; this is a good way to ward off pink eye as well as other infections.

Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease

A person with hand, foot, and mouth disease (HFMD) may show tell-tale signs like fever, sore throat, mouth ulcers on the inside of the mouth or sides of the tongue, rash or small blisters on palms of hands, soles of feet, and/or buttocks, as well as lethargy, and poor appetite. Both adults and children can be affected, but children aged five or younger are generally more susceptible. HFMD is highly infectious, so it is important to keep infected individuals away from others. The key to a quick recovery is adequate fluids and rest. Iced drinks or popsicles can help alleviate the pain caused by mouth ulcers while keeping the infected person hydrated. Should the patient become dehydrated, they may require hospitalisation for intravenous hydration. Keep in mind that the virus may still be found in the stools for a few months after recovery, so it is imperative that your family maintains good hygiene habits.

Prevention tip:- Lower the risk of becoming infected by washing your hands frequently with soap and water and avoiding contact with those who are infected.

Stomach flu

Stomach flu is a lot worse than a “tummy ache” as it causes vomiting, diarrhoea, and intense abdominal pain. There are a wide variety of viruses that can cause it but most stomach viruses clear up within a few days to a week and require nothing more than rest. If your child shows symptoms of stomach flu, keep them hydrated with water and isotonic drinks, and avoid spicy food and dairy products until the symptoms resolve. Consult a doctor immediately if your child has a fever of more than 38.5°C, severe abdominal pain, or an inability to hydrate due to severe vomiting.

Prevention tip:- If someone in your family contracts stomach flu, it is highly likely that someone else will become affected in approximately 48 hours. The best way to contain the virus is to keep the person already affected in isolation.

When to keep your child at home?

If you believe your child is genuinely unwell, you can help protect others by keeping them at home until they are well and no longer contagious. If you're unsure, remember to check in with a doctor.

School Drop Off Tips

Concordia International Shanghai shares key drop off tips for parents with young children.

It's only natural for children to feel anxious when saying goodbye to their parents. It can occur multiple times in the early years (even into primary school) and can even begin later in the year. Some children seem to be doing just fine with transition only to experience separation anxiety a few weeks into the school year or after the holidays. As you prepare to drop your child off at school, try these strategies to help your child cope with separation anxiety:

- **Confront ambivalence.** It's perfectly normal to worry and find it hard to trust a new person/school with your little one.

But kids can pick up on your feelings. The more you hesitate the more likely your child will feel unsafe.

- **Talk your feelings out** with a friend who knows the drill to get some perspective.
- **Plan a coffee date with a friend or your spouse** immediately following drop off.
- **Get to know the school and teacher** as much as possible in advance (talking to other parents involved in the school helps!) so that you feel comfortable with the environment.





- **Creating a goodbye ritual** prior to the first day of preschool can ease some of the anxiety. Try things like a special handshake or a special wave and hug, a kiss, a high five, and say goodbye!
 - **Tuck a transitional object (e.g. a wishing stone, small photo/special charm) into your child's backpack** and fill it with love before you drop your child off each day. Notes in a kid's lunch box reminds them you love them and will return soon.
 - **Send positive signals.** While it might be tempting to sneak out the moment your child is distracted, this can actually cause stress later in the day. Acknowledge your child's feelings and normalise their worries - empathy helps your child feel safe and understood. Watch your body language. You might feel sad, but you want your child to feel safe and secure in this new, fun environment. Stand up straight and smile at your little one to model a cheerful goodbye!
 - **Stick to a routine.** Children are at their best when they have plenty of rest, eat a nutritious breakfast, and don't feel rushed. Pre-pack lunches and snacks the night before and wake up twenty minutes before your children so you can prepare, i.e. place shoes, socks, and backpacks by the door.
 - **Read about starting school.** Books such as Anna Dewdney's 'Llama Llama Misses Mama' and Audrey Penn's 'The Kissing Hand' can help ease the transition and normalise the process of separation for little ones.
- Preschool years provide a great foundation for your child's first school experience. Once you get over that initial hurdle of saying goodbye, you will see your child grow and learn in leaps and bounds! SF*

Calm in the Storm

Lorna Jutton discusses the harmonising benefits of practising mindfulness with children

Raising a young family is perhaps one of the toughest challenges on the planet. In the face of a demanding schedule and explosive tantrums, it can be hard to know how to guide yourself through the chaos, let alone your child. Mindfulness is not a magic wand, but it can be an essential ingredient in preventing and soothing stressful moments as well as strengthening family bonds.

Whether in the midst of a storm or just going about daily life, mindfulness can help enhance resilience, gratitude, and compassion. Practising mindfulness does not have to mean wearing yoga pants, meditating for hours, or achieving total peace and harmony within your household; it's the small steps and right intentions that slowly form your practice.

Here are a few activities to try out as a family:

Breathing ball: The breathing ball (Hoberman sphere) is a handy tool to help young children follow their breath: breathing in through the nose, open the ball slowly, breathing out through the mouth, close the ball slowly. Repeat a few times together. If you don't have a ball you can also use your hands to do the same movement.

Get outside: Shanghai might be rather short on nature, but it does have some fantastic parks, leafy boulevards, and green compounds. Mindfulness is all about connecting to your senses. With an open-mind, exploring the sounds, colours, shapes, textures, and smells that abound outside can help to foster a natural curiosity for what we find in the present moment. A simple game of eye-spy could be a way to help draw your child's attention to their surroundings.

Mindful eating. There's nothing like a food-based activity to grab your kids interest. Put together a few slices of apple, raisins, and pieces of chocolate, or test it out at mealtime. Practice paying attention on purpose by using your senses to explore each item. Encourage your child to notice the colour, shape, smell, texture, and taste of each mouthful.

The key with all these activities is to approach them with a light and playful attitude. If you lose your patience, your child will pick up on it. If it's not working out or they're just not interested today, that's ok. Non-judgement and compassion are cornerstones of mindfulness, so whatever you notice with these explorations, try your best to be kind to yourself and your little ones. **SE**

Glossary

ACT: A standardised test for high school achievement assessing student learning in English, Mathematics, Reading, Science and Writing. An alternative to the SAT for college applications.

American Curriculum: In Secondary school, a couple of elective courses are taken alongside several compulsory subjects such as English, Science and Maths. Generally in high school, all courses count towards credits.

Advanced Placement (AP): These are exams for senior students run by a US-based College Board. AP aims to emulate first year college courses, enabling high school students to earn college credit.

AP Capstone: AP diploma programme built on the AP Seminar and AP Research, designed to complement in-depth, discipline specific study provided through the AP courses.

British Curriculum: Follows the uniform national curriculum of England where all learning materials are produced in the UK. Exams are marked according to a standardised set of criteria.

Council of International Schools (CIS): The CIS awards schools that ensure high educational standards, and a focus on infusing an international and intercultural perspective into their programmes. It takes one to two years of self-assessment before schools can be accredited.

CITA: The Commission on International and Trans-Regional Accreditation is a US-run agency that enforces internationally recognised high educational standards in its schools.

EAL/EFL/ESL: These programmes offer assistance for students learning English as a second language, with half or full-day programmes and individual tutoring during non-school hours.

High Scope Curriculum: Emphasises a hands-on approach to learning in early childhood education. Eight content areas provide its Key Developmental Indicators.

IB (PYP) (MYP) (DP): The International Baccalaureate Programme includes Primary Years, Middle Years, and Diploma Programmes. IB fosters critical

thinking, problem solving, research, and writing skills. The DP requires six courses, Theory of Knowledge (philosophy), and a 4,000-word extended essay. The IBDP is accepted in college applications worldwide.

IGCSE: The International General Certificate of Secondary Education is taken between the ages of 14 and 16. Students are required to study core topics along with a select number of over 70 optional topics. Typically, qualified students move on to study AP or IB and occasionally A Levels.

IPC: The International Primary Curriculum aims to instill in children a desire to learn by focusing on three aspects of subject matter: knowledge, skill, and understanding.

Montessori: Theory of education characterised by freedom within limits, thus facilitating the development of the child's independence. Methods focus on the child's natural learning process, honed by independently working with materials rather than direct instruction.

NEASC: The New England Association of Schools and Colleges is a US-based organisation which helps international schools adhere to publicly stated standards and objectives.

NCCT: The National Centre for School Curriculum and Textbook Development is a non-governmental agency for schools seeking both international and Chinese accreditation. The NCCT helps to develop and assess school curricula, textbooks, and teaching methods.

SAT: An aptitude test used in the US mainly for college applications. A newly revamped SAT released in Spring 2016 includes changes to scoring and testing content. The test comprises three parts: Evidence-based Reading and Writing, Maths, and an optional Essay.

TOEFL: Test of English as a Foreign Language assesses English proficiency. International students applying to English speaking universities are required to take the TOEFL exam.

WASC: The Western Association of Schools and Colleges is an American organisation that assesses and accredits schools that successfully undergo a six-year accreditation process. **SF**
